

Water & Gold

A tour of around 2,200km 8 days means you average under 300km a day which leaves a lot of time to explore the totally diverse areas you'll be passing through with time to discover some of the history of the regions.

Day 1 starts by following the Coorong and South Australian Limestone Coast down to our first overnight stop at Mount Gambier.

Day 2 and the spectacular scenery starts. We continue to hug the coast as we visit lovely locations like Port Fairy, the Warrnambool Maritime Museum. Port Campbell, Cape Otway Lighthouse before arriving in our overnight stop at Apollo Bay.

Day 3 going east along the Great Ocean Road to Geelong. There plenty of scenic stops before we arrive in Ballarat, famous for it's gold mining in the 1800's. Tonight will be a chance to see the spectacular sound and light show "Blood on the Southern Cross".



Day 4. There is so much to see and do in Ballarat but Sovereign Hill is a must as is the Eureka Stockade Centre,

Day 5 and we have breaks at some classic Victorian towns like Daylesford and Hepburn Springs. We travel through some beautiful country ready for our stop at Bendigo tonight.

Day 6 and a bit more exploring Bendigo before moving on to Echuca with a couple of hours of taking in the sights before settling down for the night.

Day 6, and Echuca will fill most of the day. Here we have the National Holden Museum, the Port of Echuca historic precinct, the chance to ride on a paddle steamer and more. We will head west late in the day and camp at Lake Boga. (the flying boat centre for Australia in WW2.)

Day 7 and a visit the Swan Hill with an opportunity to visit the Swan Hill Pioneer Settlement, a village that really makes you feel as though you've stepped back in time. By evening we will be at Mildura for the nights stop.

Day 8 and a quick look around Mildura before heading back to South Australia with stops at the river towns before arriving back in Adelaide just before dark.
