

Whales & Tuna

There is probably nowhere better in Australia than the head of the Great Australia Bight to observe the great whale migration and breeding area. From the cliff top you will look down on the whales just below you. This tour will also include some excellent coastal scenery as we travel via Port Lincoln on our way home. This is a long tour of around 2,800km.

Day 1 and we head north. Our first longer stop will be at Port Augusta to visit the Wadlata Outback Centre, a worthwhile interpretive facility that will give you a feel for the country we are entering. From here we will continue driving west until we find a nice remote camp for the night.

Day 2 and a stop at Ceduna to stock up with supplies before heading out onto the Nullarbour Plain for the 280km drive to the whale watching area at the head of the bight. This will be a bush camp, no facilities, but you will be comfortable in your luxury suite when not out watching the whales.

Day 3 and whale watching is the activity for the day.

Day 4 will be a day of spectacular coastal scenery as we follow the coast, visit seal colonies, spectacular bays before arriving at Sheringa, a bush camp renowned for salmon fishing. There are lines on board if you want to scale the cliff to the beach and try your luck.

Day 5 and we detour to via Coffin Bay (where fresh oysters are available) on our way to Australia's Tuna capital, Port Lincoln. Having been bush camping for a couple of days tonight we'll be in a caravan park tonight.

Day 6 will be full of activities with a choice of tuna farm tours, coastal tours, fishing charters, museums and more. The day can be pre-planned or booked on the day We'll leave Port Lincoln late in the afternoon, camp before dark at a nice coastal town on the way back to Adelaide.

Day 7 will be a long day as we head back to Adelaide. This can be broken into two days and this will be determined on the booking form.
